*I want to take a regular college preparatory course.

→ Traditional English

This course is a survey of all strands of language arts. Students complete units on short stories, non-fiction, the epics, the novel, poetry, the play, expository writing, and research. Additional assignments include vocabulary, outside reading, and lessons on writing mechanics.

*I currently have an A or B in middle school English and I plan on taking an AP English course as an upperclassman.

→ Honors English

This course introduces students to the AP English standards with a focus on analyzing literature through analytical writing and public speaking. Students read and dissect classic Greek literature, Shakespeare, and poetry in addition to modern texts using literary concepts.

Graduation Requirements

Four years of high school English are required. College bound students should try to take an AP English their junior or senior year. All English classes help prepare students for success after high school and meet college entrance requirements.

What should I take as a 9th grader?

You should make your decision based on these things:

The recommendation of your middle school math instructor. Your math instructor is in the best position to determine where you should be placed to ensure success. Many things go into this recommendation:

- (1) your achievement.
- (2) your "readiness" to proceed.
- (3) your ability to do abstract thinking, which is sometimes difficult to judge.

You should also think about your goals post high school:

A student who is college-bound has different math needs than one who is not. Please discuss your options with your parents, current math instructor, and counselor. All math programs offered at Lyons High School prepare students for CMAS, PSAT, ACT, SAT, and college mathematics courses.

Graduation Requirements

Three years of high school math are required. College bound students should take four years of math. All math classes help prepare students for success after high school and meet college entrance requirements.

What should I take as a 9th grader?

*I want to take a regular college preparatory course.

→ Biology

The course emphasis is on the structure and function of living things and the relationship of living things to their environments. Students will learn biological content that will help them be informed and contributing citizens in today's society. The course utilizes investigation and inquiry-based scientific processes.

*I have an A or B in middle school science and I plan on taking an AP course as an upperclassman. → Honors Biology

Students will become familiar with the growing field of biochemistry as they learn about the molecules of life, enzyme activity, photosynthesis, cellular respiration, DNA replication, and protein synthesis. They will explore the relationship between structure and function as they learn parts of plant and animal systems and cells. Students will note the unity of life, and its diversity, as they study mitosis, genetics, evolution, and taxonomy. Other emphases are on planning an investigation, becoming familiar with scientific notation and significant digits, analyzing data, checking validity of conclusions, and writing lab reports.

Graduation Requirements

Three years of high school science are required. College bound students should think about taking four years of science. All science classes help prepare students for success after high school and meet college entrance requirements.

→ World Geography/History

This course integrates World Geography and World History and provides a base of knowledge for regions of the world. Along with the physical geography and history of the region, economic, political, social, and cultural aspects of human activity are studied. The themes of geography and history are used to explore and analyze the past and relate historical events to present global issues. The course utilizes geographic and historical skills to analyze maps, readings, and documents in order to dive into critical thinking skills in a collaborative environment.

Graduation Requirements

Three years of high school social studies are required. All social studies classes help prepare students for success after high school and meet college entrance requirements.

What should I take as a 9th grader?

All 9th graders take a semester of health and and personal financial literacy (social studies elective graduation requirement). Most 9th graders take at least on semester of physical education and some additional electives.

Graduation Requirements

Students are required to take 0.5 credits of practical arts, 0.5 credits fine arts, 0.5 credits health, 2.0 credits of physical education, and 7.5-8.0 credits of general electives to meet graduation requirements.


